Please bring your own service and a side dish to share if possible. There is no charge for the dinner, but any donation to help defray cost is appreciated. The donation bucket will be placed in a well lighted area so no one accidentally drops a \$100 bill in (but it's OK if you meant to, thanks).

✓ Turkey Machine Shoot - The San Diego County Muzzle Loaders will once again have their Turkey Shoot Machine at the Primitive Range Friday, Saturday, and Sunday for a match at 3:00 PM each day. The competitor will be in the blind loaded and primed, they will operate a turkey call and if good enough a turkey head will appear. We will provide box and wing bone calls or the competitor can use their own. Hits by rifles are pretty self evident, hits by smoothbores will be judged kills by observers (the other competitors). The competitor with the most turkey kills at the end of the match on Sunday will be crowned "Best Turkey Hunter." Three shots for \$1.00 (to be paid at the range). All proceeds will go to the Western Nationals.

✓ Blunderbuss Championship Match - All you need is a historically correct Blunderbuss and some period attire. The match will be held on the Primitive Range Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

The match consists of 5 shots at the NMLRA 100 yard rifle target at approximately 20 yards. Then 5 shots using minimum 000 buck at a gong at approximately 20 yards while seated on a buggy seat that tends to bounce a little; you load and get yourself comfortably seated, then prime; when you're ready, you say "Giddyap" and the seat will begin to bounce; it's up to the competitor to ring the gong to the satisfaction of the judge. Next, you're off to the clay pigeons where 5 will be thrown for you.

A perfect score on the 100 yard target is 50; each ring of the gong is worth 10 points; birds are worth 10 points a hit. Total perfect score is 150. Medals to first place only for Men, Women and Juniors. Even if you don't have a Blunderbuss to participate, this should be a fun event to watch!

The Range Committees and Match Committees are here to serve you. If you have comments, suggestions, and so forth, please contact someone whose name is published under the appropriate entry listed.

Challenging a Score

Challenge fee: challenge your own target score: \$1.00. Challenge another shooter's target: \$5.00. If your challenge in either of the above cases is denied, you will lose the fee. However, if there has been a scoring error, your money will be refunded.

To have your challenge processed, pick up a Challenge Form and pay your fee at the Registration Desk. You will have 24 hours to challenge after the match has been posted on the Scoring Board. Challenges will be addressed on the same day they are reported to the Scoring Department.

Note: You are encouraged to check the scoreboard frequently throughout the week and report errors immediately. To report posting errors or to question a score, please fill out a report slip available at the Target Desk and leave it with the target sales staff. If you still disagree with the decision of the scoring room director, then a challenge is necessary.

Rules

Please Observe All of the Official Range Rules and Regulations

The following rules are for your immediate information:

1. Only black powder or BATF approved black powder substitute permitted.
2. Ignition is by percussion cap that fits on nipple, or by flint stone striking frizzen. (Exceptions: Wheel locks with original-type ignition, and primers in slug guns.)
3. **No intoxicants are to be used on firing line.**
4. **No smoking on firing line. Keep powder containers closed.**
5. **No loaded firearms can be taken from the firing line unless accompanied by a range officer.**
6. If you have targets that you want to pick up from the Scoring Department, please notify personnel *before the last relay on Sunday*. The targets will be pulled from the shelf and held for you until the Awards Ceremony is complete; after the Awards Ceremony is complete, immediately report to the Scoring Department to retrieve your targets. Pistol targets may be picked up immediately following the Pistol Awards.
7. Safety shields must be used on all flintlock bench rifles and cross-stick rifles.
8. No firearms are to be fired on the covered firing line after the close of each day's matches.
9. No firing of cannons on the range.
10. For safety's sake, hearing protection is recommended. Eye protection must be worn by competitors and spectators while on the main range (sunglasses and prescription eyewear are acceptable substitutes).
11. Police your shooting area after you have completed your match.
12. Slug gun bench targets fired only on the Slug Gun Range.
13. Daily reentry protest period will end the following day at noon. Prizes will be distributed after protest period.
14. Protest and challenge period will end Monday at 9:00 A.M. *Protests and challenges will not be allowed after the conclusion of the official score protest and challenge period.*
15. See program information above on how to challenge a score.
16. All offhand matches, except Schuetzen, are to be fired on the Offhand Range.
17. Schuetzen matches (10 shots) may be fired in two consecutive relays in the same day. Schuetzen matches may be fired with roundball or bullet and are to be fired on the Slug Gun Range.
18. All false muzzles will be attached to the loading bench by a cord or similar device, so that the firearm may not be placed in a firing position without removal of the false muzzle.
19. Specific, posted individual range rules take precedence over NMLRA Official Rules.
20. Off-the-shelf guns, chunk guns, muskets, squirrel rifles, one gun, buffalo, and smoothbore guns must be inspected by the range officer for sights and authenticity and must receive a sticker.
21. Any rifle rest with spikes or pointed feet are not permitted for use directly on the shooting benches. Rifle rest with spikes or pointed feet must use "pucks" and or other devices that stops the spikes or pointed feet from coming into contact with the benchtop surface. Any rifle rest feet that damage the benchtop surface are not permitted.

National Rifle Matches are not squadded; all matches are timed relays. This gives competitors the opportunity to shoot their chosen matches during any day of the national competition. Last day for all reentry, aggregate, and match competition is Sunday.

Bench Range: 50, 100, and 200 yd. ranges—45 minute relays; Offhand Range: 25, 50, and 100 yd. ranges—30 minute relays.

Slug Range: 100, 200, and 300 yd. ranges—45 minute relays; Chunk Gun and Silhouette ranges—45 minute relays; Pistol: 25 and 50 yds.—30 minute relays.

Firing Line Rifle Procedure – Ranges open at 8:00 a.m.

1. **All competitors** must register at the Registration Desk in the Registration Building. Registration fees are \$50.00; Juniors register for \$10.00 (a Junior is a shooter who has not had their eighteenth birthday; Juniors must be sponsored by an adult member). After registering, pistol shooters report to Pistol Range; trap and skeet shooters report to Trap and Skeet Range; and primitive competitors to Primitive Range.
2. All Rifle and Primitive Matches may be purchased at the Target Desk in the Registration Building.
 - a. **SHOOTERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PURCHASING CORRECT TARGETS FOR THEIR MATCHES AND/OR AGGREGATES.**
 - b. Identification marks on targets are as follows: Red dot—50 yards offhand; os represents open sights.
3. When requesting targets, give the attendant the match number(s) you wish to shoot. Be correct in giving your *registration number*. Always wear your registration badge so that your number can be double-checked. When sending others to purchase targets for you, send a slip with your number on it along with the purchaser; do not depend on memory. All matches except for reentries may be fired only once. Match prices vary, check program.
4. **Aggregates must be entered before purchasing or firing any individual matches in the aggregate. Should you fire an individual match that is included in an aggregate, you can no longer purchase that aggregate. If you shoot an individual match that is included in an aggregate you have already entered, you have automatically disqualified both of your scores. To prevent this, purchase the complete aggregate package. Take time to check those matches included in the aggregate against your program. In this way you will not repeat matches, resulting in disqualification.**
5. You may shoot any match in any relay.
 - a. While a relay is in process, find an open position. At the order of the range officer, you will hang your own target. Be sure to verify your target is on the correct position and at the proper yardage before the relay starts.
 - b. Flint shields are provided for the protection of all shooters. Please leave shielded positions open for flint shooters.
 - c. Get your bench and/or other gear to your shooting position and loading table in preparation for the next relay. Do not load your gun before the relay begins.
 - d. In Bench Matches, please remove your bench from the firing line when you do not plan to shoot the next relay.
6. Your score will be posted under the match number and beside your registration number on a position sheet at the Registration Building. *Always* check to make sure your score is posted correctly. If an error has been made, report to the Target Desk *immediately*. In the event a shooter leaves the range before their score is posted, it is the shooter's responsibility to have someone check their score.

Notice of Change in Offhand Rifle Classification

The rifle offhand classification program was originally set up so that competitors shooting the Classification Aggregate (Agg. CA) would not be placed in their classification *until the following shoot*. The NMLRA Rifle Committee has made a change to the program whereby competitors *can be placed* into their classification *following the completion of the Classification Aggregate (Agg. CA)*.

First time competitors: Competitors *must notify the Target Desk upon completion* of all four matches in the Classification Aggregate (Agg. CA). Competitors should check the scoreboard at a later date to make sure scores have been posted in the *correct* classification.

Upgrading classification: Competitors wanting to upgrade to a higher classification may also take advantage of this change. Competitors *must notify the Target Desk upon completion* of all four matches in the Classification Aggregate (Agg. CA). Scores will be tallied and if competitor has scored out of their current classification, competitor will be moved to new classification. Competitors should check the scoreboard at a later date to make sure scores are posted in the *correct* classification.

Below are the four rifle offhand classifications based on 200 point agg:

Master – 88% to 100% (176 points and above)

Expert – 83% to 87% (166 – 175 points)

Sharpshooter – 75% to 82% (150 – 165 points)

Marksman – below 75% (149 points and below)

Based on 150 point agg:

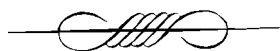
Master – 132 points and above

Expert – 125 – 131

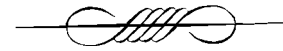
Sharpshooter – 113 – 130

Aggregate fee is \$3.50 (exception: Agg. BP \$5.00) plus \$4.00 per match (exceptions: Junior matches \$1.00 per match; Running Boar \$5.00 per match; Black Powder Cartridge Matches \$10.00). **Please note:** Matches listed within an aggregate may be entered as an individual match (unless otherwise stated). Please see Rule #4 under "Firing Line Procedure" for further information.

Aggregate AA Western Founders Championship

5 shots—roundball. Matches in this aggregate cannot be purchased individually.

- A-1 50 yards, rest, open sights, 6-bull target.
- A-2 25 yards, offhand, any metallic sights, 6-bull target.
- A-3 50 yards, offhand, any metallic sights, 100-yard target.
- A-4 100 yards, rest, any metallic sights, 6-bull L target.

Aggregate C Flintlock Bench Championship

5 shots—roundball.

- Match 170 50 yards, open sights, 6-bull target.
- Match 171 50 yards, any metallic sights, 6-bull target.
- Match 174 200 yards, any metallic sights, 200-yard target.
- Match 175 100 yards, any metallic sights, 6-bull L target.

Aggregate D Musket Championship

10 shots—musket as issued—offhand 2 Relays—minnie or roundball.



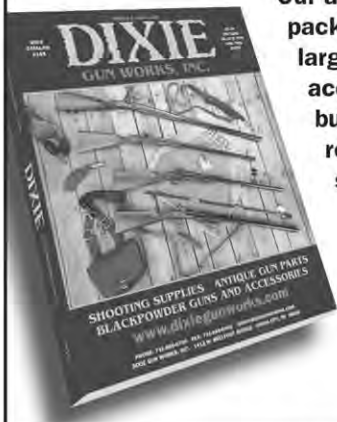

Period attire: Common attire from 1642 to 1840 is required to be worn by all match competitors and junior coaches. The exceptions are competitors in Matches 623, 623J and 624.

Loading from pouch and horn: All loading will be done with components carried upon your person. A separate powder measure will be used in loading at all times. Loading blocks are allowed. Paper military type cartridges are not allowed.

Roundball only: A roundball or shot will be used in all matches.

Period ramrod: The ramrod used for loading and carried during the match will be of material common to the period (wood, steel, iron, brass, bronze, horn, antler, bone, baleen). It will fit in the thimbles of the gun and the gun will be safe to fire when it is in place. The ramrod is not required to be in the thimbles when firing.

Sights: Open and fixed non-adjustable sights only, except as noted for Match 608. Firearms used in the smoothbore matches will have no rear sight above the plane of the barrel.

Sighting aids: No sighting aids will be on the competitors glasses.

Fire starting: When participating in matches that require multiple tasks, all necessary tools will be carried at all times; EXCEPT when attending the fire making task - ALL POWDER CONTAINERS will be removed from the person and the area.

Aggregate PA Copper State Primitive Aggregate, Men—Composed of matches 613, 614, and 615.

Aggregate PB Copper State Primitive Aggregate, Women—Composed of matches 616, 617, and 618.

Aggregate PJ Copper State Primitive Aggregate, Junior—Composed of matches 613J, 614J, and 615J.

Match 600 Men's Open Seneca—Flintlock or percussion rifle running match, 5 shots offhand from 5 stations at various targets and at various distances, 10 minute limit on approx. 300 yard round-trip course. Match 602 Flintlock Seneca—Same as Open Seneca. Targets same as above.

Match 603 Smoothbore Flintlock Seneca—Flintlock smoothbore only. Running match, 5 shots offhand from 5 stations at various targets at various distances, 10 minute time limit on approx. 300 yard round-trip course. Targets same as above.

Match 604A Mountain Man Aggregate—Flintlock only. Rifle, 3 to 5 shots, tomahawk and knife throwing, flint and steel fire-making.

Match 604B Mountain Man Aggregate—Caplock only. Rifle, 3-5 shots, tomahawk and knife throwing, flint and steel firemaking.

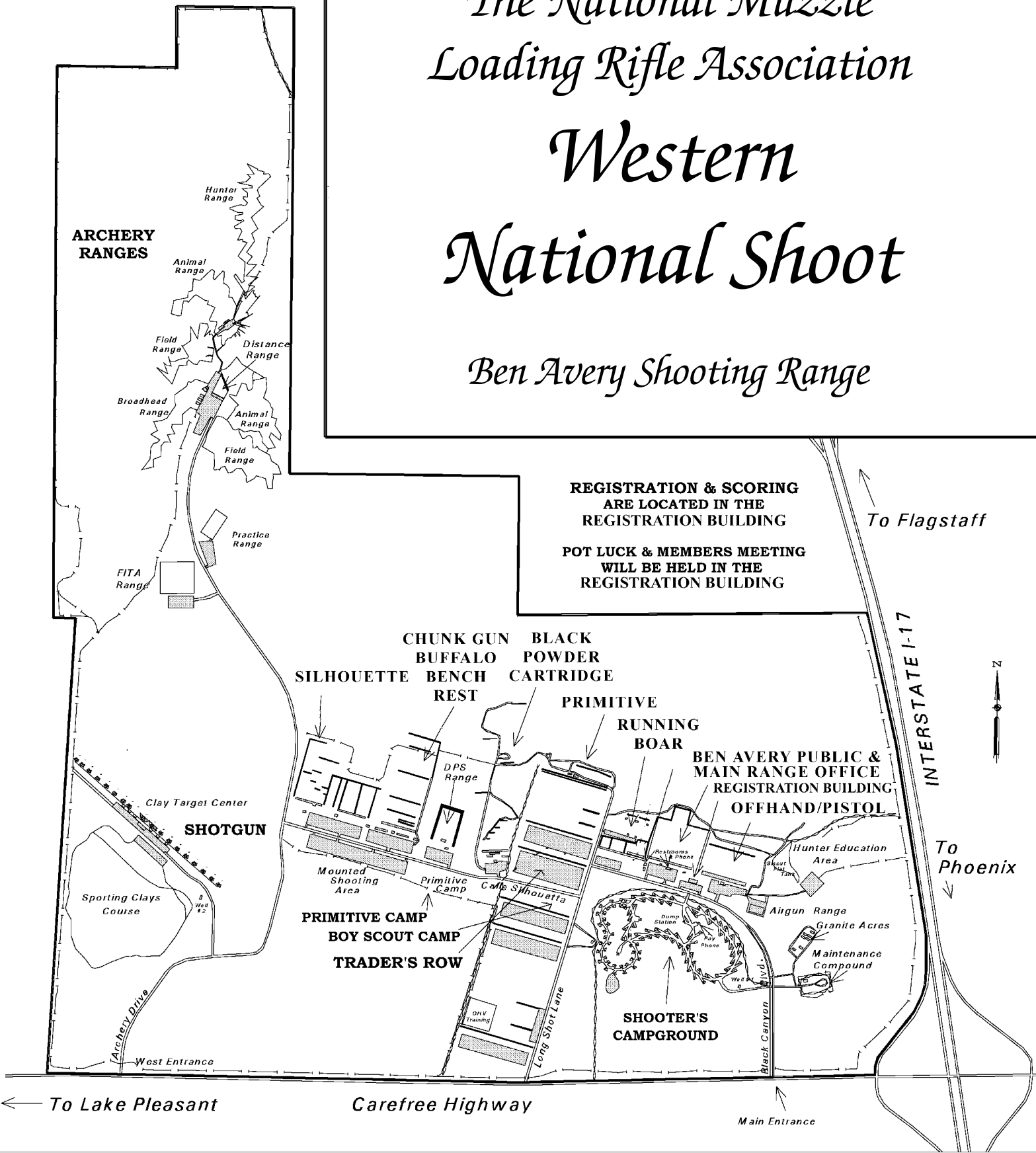
